

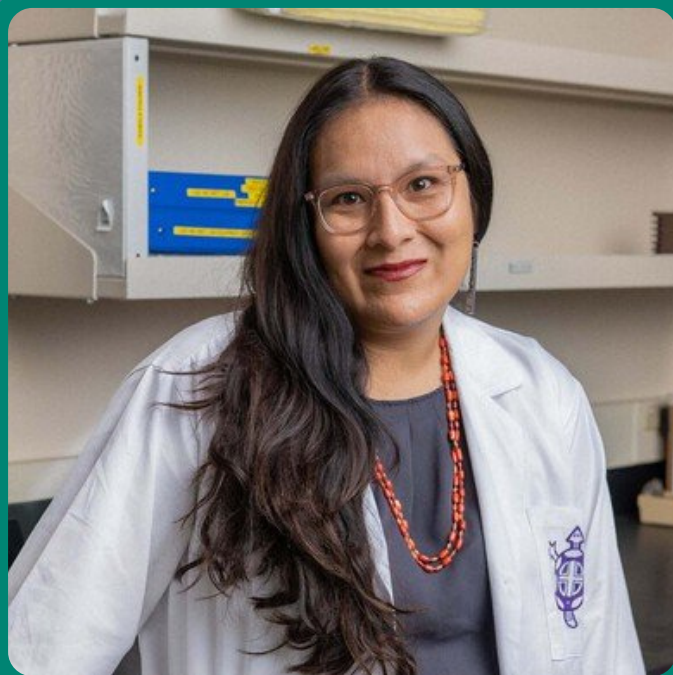

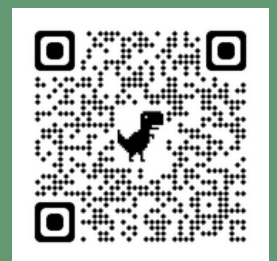

ABSTRACT: Dr. Krystal Tsosie (Diné) is one of the co-founders of the Native BioData Consortium (NBDC), a nonprofit research institute led by Indigenous scientists and Tribal members in the United States to ensure that advances in genetics and human health research benefit all Indigenous people.
